- · Accessing GP services


- How the cost of living is affecting our health

Feedback sparks overhaul of hospital complaints process



Feedback from patients who made a complaint about their care at Salisbury District Hospital is being used to overhaul its complaints handling process.

Healthwatch Wiltshire's report highlights the findings of a survey which heard the views of people who had been through the hospital's complaints handling process between April and June 2022.

Patients and their families told us of feeling lost in the system, that they weren't listened to and had little confidence that changes would be made following the issues they had raised.

These experiences have led to a review of the way the hospital handles complaints by Salisbury NHS Foundation Trust, which manages it.



People to benefit from NHS@Home virtual wards



People living in Bath and North East Somerset, Swindon and Wiltshire are now able to receive acute clinical care from the comfort of their own home while helping to relieve pressures on local services.

NHS@Home Virtual Wards is a joint initiative being provided by local health and care organisations to support suitable patients to receive the same high level of care, assessment, monitoring and treatment at home or their place of residence, as they would as an inpatient on a hospital ward. This service is also sometimes known as Hospital at Home.

Cost of living: People avoiding NHS appointments



New Healthwatch England data suggests people are increasingly avoiding prescriptions and travelling to NHS appointments due to spiralling costs.

Healthwatch England found that more people avoided getting prescription medicines, and booking NHS appointments, including dental treatment, due to the fear of extra costs, in December 2022 than in October.

More than a third of the respondents (39%) said the changes they have made to keep up with the rising cost of living have negatively affected their mental health, while 35% said their physical health had got worse in the last two months. The findings also suggest women are more affected by spiralling costs compared to men.
